



2006 SPRING PROJECT NOMINATION FORM

Background:

In May 2006, West Chester Rotarians, family members and friends, both new and old, undertook the daunting, but ultimately very rewarding, task of “making over” the home at 303 W. Washington Street. By the time we finished, we had repaired and rejuvenated the outside; brightened and rehabilitated the inside; and returned necessary services to the home. The Brighter Future Sub-committee now seeks nominations for a similar activity to serve as its 2006 Spring Project.

Instructions:

1. Submit your completed nomination form either to Ann Mintz or to Chuck Hawkins by Thursday, March 16; selection day is March 17, so don't be late.
2. Assuming that the nominated worksite is a family dwelling (*see #5 below*), it must be a) owner-occupied by a non-Rotarian at the time of the nomination and b) owned by the same party on May 13, the intended project work day.
3. *Ineligible* for consideration is any building in which a Rotary Club of West Chester member has a financial interest of any type. However, remaining eligible is a building the mortgage for which is held by a financial institution employing a Rotarian.
4. Although a nomination can originate from any source, a West Chester Rotarian must submit it to the Brighter Future Sub-committee for consideration.

5. Because the sub-committee cannot estimate the number of nominations, it is opening the eligible worksites to include, along with family dwellings, any structure determined by some authority to hold historical significance for West Chester.
