SPEAKERS REVIEW by Faith Woodward

Dave Rayburn introduced our speaker, Marjorie Johnson who has been a counselor for twenty-five years specializing in conflict management and marriage counseling.

Her topic was "Developing Smart Leaders, The Role of Emotional Intelligence in Superior Leadership".

Marjorie quoted Benjamin Zander, conductor of the Boston Pops, "A great conductor makes no music... his job is to empower those in front of him to make music." Leaders need to "bring out the music" from their employees. A good leader should want to make a difference not want to have power.

Studies have shown that 50 to 70% of success comes from emotional intelligence. Emotional Intelligence is the key to leadership presence, people management for results, communication effectiveness, organizational growth, and work life balance.

Emotional intelligence competencies for leaders include self awareness (emotional self awareness, accurate self awareness, and self confidence), self management (including self control, the ability to be open,

adaptability, achievement, initiative, and optimism), social awareness (empathy, organizational awareness, and service), and relationship management (inspiration, influence, developing others, change catalyst, conflict management, and teamwork and collaboration).

The work/life balance is important. The best leaders surround themselves with good employees to whom they delegate. Marjorie recommends succession planning for every good leader. Those who sustain good leadership are humble with an initiative of steel.
